Intellectual Property and Copyright

Intellectual property protects original ideas, inventions, or creations from being unlawfully copied.

As the Committee for Publication Ethics writes: “Intellectual property laws give authors certain legal rights of control and exclusivity over the products of their work. With the availability of open access publishing, journals may allow authors to retain copyright and grant a publishing licence to the journal and/or a Creative Commons licence for reuse.” (COPE Core Practice No. 7)

The Journal of Ethics in Higher Education agrees that the author retains copyright of their work and grants a publishing licence to the Journal. This work is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike 4.0 International Licence.

However, the intellectual property created by the author during this assignment also belongs materially to the publisher, as a consequence of the work involved in inter alia the review and editing, and publication processes.

Consequently, once an author submits an article to the JEHE platform and it passes peer review, the intellectual property remains with the author, but Globethics Publications holds a legitimate claim for the work not to be submitted elsewhere for republication.
